#### Gila River Fire Department honored with Freedom Award

The Gila River Fire Department (GRFD) has been recognized with the prestigious Employer Support Freedom Award, the highest honor the U.S. Department of Defense gives employers who support National Guard and Reserve Service members.

The award acknowledges the department's commitment to service members by providing flexible scheduling, career development opportunities, and unwavering support for employees who serve in the military.

Terry McCollom, military outreach coordinator for Arizona, presented the Employer Support Freedom award and individual Patriotic Employer awards to GRFD's Chief Kathy Garcia, Capt. Adrian Hernandez, Capt. Lloyd Gray, and S.C. Matthew Jairus Pierce, on Jan. 23.

According to McCollom, there are 2.2 million service members in active duty, 800,000 in the Guard Reserve, and only 45,000 employers employ reserve service members.

"To have an employer like the [Gila River] Fire Department treat a service member like they do is important," said McCollom. "30 years ago, or so, they started these awards, and the service member can nominate their employer if they feel that they were

above and beyond, and there's no question in this particular case that they were definitely above and beyond."

Antonio Munoz nominated GRFD for their unwavering support after he sustained an injury and could not work during his recovery.

Munoz has been with the department for over 3 years and is part of the 610 CACs (Command and Control Squadron) reserve

unit with the Davis-Monthan Air Force Base.

"I got a pretty good injury to myself. I ruptured my Achilles tendon, and it completely put me out. I couldn't walk," said Munoz. "I was in crutches and a scooter for a while and during that whole time, the individuals that got selected really helped me out throughout the process, the transition, and then getting back to work"

Munoz explained that Garcia worked with him to hold his position in the department. At the same time, Gray ensured communications with everyone, and Hernandez reached out to check in and make sure recovery was going well.

"From his captain to his shift commander, to the training captain, it shows that everybody's looking out for each other and that's what I always strive for, to

take care of each other so I think these awards show that that is what we're doing," said Garcia who accepted the award, emphasizing the department's dedication to its employees and those who balance both firefighting and military duties.

"I was really surprised to be recognized. I didn't have any expectations or anything. I just came here to support the chief," said Hernandez.

It's a testament to the leadership that we currently have. I think it's an example of who our organization is, and what we are and what we're about," said Pierce. "I think that we value each and every one of our employees, but especially our military."

#### SR 347/Riggs Road traffic interchange project moves to design phase

The Arizona Department of Transportation (ADOT) has selected the design for reconstruction of the Riggs Road intersection at State Route 347 to separate traffic on a new bridge. This decision follows extensive agency and public involvement on potential design concept alternatives for the interchange, including public meetings in August 2024. The project is now in the final design phase.

The project will raise SR 347 on a new bridge over Riggs Road to provide free-flowing traffic movements at this location. SR 347 on- and off-ramps with traffic signals will provide access to and from Riggs Road. The project is designed to enhance safety, reduce traffic congestion and improve travel times to enhance

regional mobility.

The project is a partnership between ADOT, the Gila River Indian Community and the Maricopa Association of Governments, in coordination with the Bureau of Indian Affairs.

The selected design, presented in the August public meetings

as Alternative B1, is a tight diamond design where the on- and off-ramps are in a diamond shape. The key elements of this design are:

 SR 347 traffic will travel on a new bridge over Riggs Road, which will remain at grade level.

- SR 347 will be shifted to the east and Riggs Road will be shifted to the south to avoid the Gila River Indian Community electrical substation.
- SR 347 will have two lanes in each direction; however, the project

will be designed and constructed to allow for future widening to three lanes in each direction.

Riggs Road will have two lanes in each direction at the intersection, as well as a left-turn and right-turn lane in each direction to access SR 347.

The final Design Concept Report (DCR), which features the design concept for the interchange, is available on the project webpage.

The project is expected to complete design and be ready to advertise for construction by early 2026.

Any person who meets the qualifications listed below in accordance to the Constitution, may file a declaration of candidacy for office of Community Council during the declaration period.

Constitution & Bylaws (1960) of the GILA RIVER INDIAN COMMUNITY

#### ARTICLE VI - QUALIFICATIONS OF OFFICERS

Section 1. No person shall be elected or hold office as Governor, Lieutenant Governor, Chief Judge, Associate Judges or Councilman unless he:

- 1. Is a member of the Community:
- 2. Has reached the age of 25 years;
- Has been living in the particular District he is to represent for at least 60 days immediately preceding the election;
- Has been living on the Reservation for at least one year immediately preceding the election.
   Additional qualifications may be prescribed by law or ordinance.

Section 2. No person who, within the year preceding the election, has been convicted of a crime involving moral turpitude shall be eligible to hold office in the Community.

Declaration of Candidacy (DOC) forms will be available February 7.



#### Have you filed for Disability Claim?



#### **Submitted by** Veteran & Family Services Office

Some of you have filed claims in the past. Some conditions may have been approved, while other conditions were denied. No matter how long ago it was, have you considered re-opening denied claims?

The rules for the VA are ever changing. Your denied conditions can probably be re-opened which may lead to a higher disability rating and increasing your monthly compensation.

One of the many things accomplished by the PACT Act was allowing the VA to consider Toxic Exposure. This means that not only do they look at presumptive conditions, but now they

can look at the individual for location and chemical exposures because of your job specialty. You may not know that your medical conditions can be service connected. We are here to assist you in determining if your current medical conditions are connected to presumptive conditions and/or Toxic Exposures.

If you have never filed a claim, we encourage you to do so! We will walk you through the process and do most, if not all of your paperwork. VA compensation is non-reportable and non-taxable. The amounts can range from \$175 per month to almost \$4,000 per month. Please consider refiling. If you have service connected disabilities and pass away before your spouse, then there's a possibility that your spouse may qualify for a monthly benefit for the rest of their life. We can explain in advance what needs to be done for possible qualification for this benefit.

If you are an enrolled

Tribal Veteran using the VA and your overall disability percentage is 40% or lower, then you qualify for a VA co-pay waiver! The Tribe in which you are enrolled doesn't matter. Our office can assist you in filing the document that will exempt you from co-pays for office visits and medications.

#### How to Recognize and Respond to a Natural Gas Leak

Natural gas lines can be buried anywhere, even where homes don't use natural gas. So it's important that EVERYONE knows how to recognize and respond to a natural gas leak.

#### SIGNS OF A LEAK MAY INCLUDE:



#### SMELL

A distinct sulfur-like odor, similar to rotten eggs, even if it's faint or momentary.



#### HEAR

A hissing or roaring coming from the ground or aboveground pipeline.



#### SEE

Dirt or water blowing into the air, unexplained dead or dying plants or grass, or standing water continuously bubbling.

#### IF YOU SUSPECT A NATURAL GAS LEAK:

#### DO...

- LEAVE. Evacuate the area and inform others to do the same, leaving doors open as you exit.
- CALL. From a safe location, call 911 and Southwest Gas at 877-860-6020, day or night. A Southwest Gas representative will respond as soon as possible.

#### DON'T...

- Smoke or use matches/lighters.
- ▼ Turn electrical switches, thermostats, or appliance controls on or off.
  - Start/stop engines or use automated garage doors.






