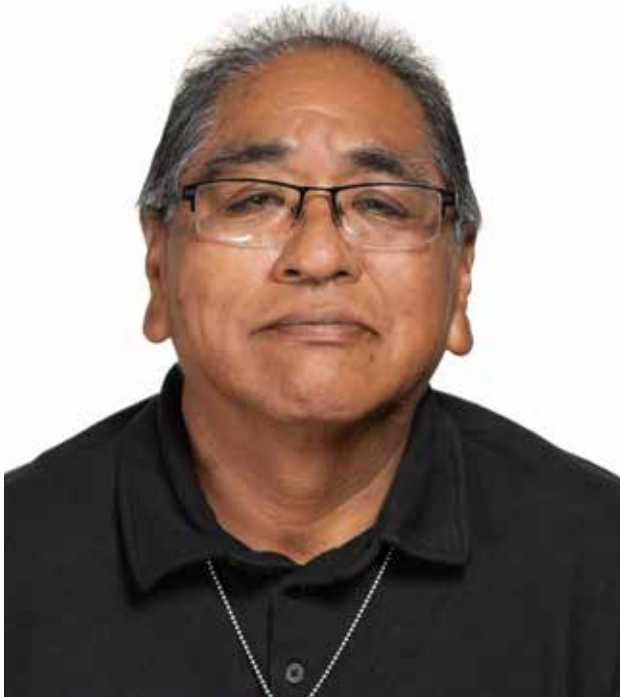

I am the son of Jewel and Scott Bishop and I am the grandson of the late Wilfred and Harriet Wellington. I received my Bachelor’s degree from Northern Arizona University in 2012 where I studied Economics and Community Planning. Upon graduation I started working for the Community from the very bottom and worked my way up. I was a Recreation Aide in District 4 before transferring to become the receptionist at the Human Resources Department and later moved to hiring. Since starting there I have over a decade of experience working in tribal government. The Districts, Human Resources, The Department of Land Use Planning and Zoning, The Community Manager’s Office (OCM) and The Internal Audit (IA) Department are the community departments where I held positions. At OCM and IA I really received knowledge in how our tribal government operates.

In addition to my professional experience working for the community, I am a cyclist and a bicycle mechanic and I love investing in my community by teaching bicycle maintenance and repair. Each year I organize a bike ride that is a fundraiser to buy tubes, tires, chains, tools and supplies to help the community to fix their bicycles for free on Monday evenings at the big white bus located at 56 Voak Drive Sacaton from 5:15pm-8:00pm . So many people do not have cars and the bus only runs during the week from 8am-5pm. I would like to work on expanding the hours of operation and destinations of the Gila River Transit System. In the meantime bikes give the community not only a form of transportation, health and wellness, it allows us to reconnect with the land and each other.

On 2/15/2025 I experienced harassment from GRPD officer on my annual fundraising bike ride. I tried to explain who I was and what was going on but the officer was not listening to me and continued to harass and try to intimidate me. I filed a complaint complete with witness names and phone numbers to GRPD. I eventually received a letter signed by former chief Jesse Crabtree stating that the complaint was thoroughly investigated. When I met with GRPD leadership I asked if a “thorough investigation” was completed then why were the witnesses not interviewed? They did not have an answer for me, only apologized for not doing their job. Hopefully things are improving at GRPD but sloppy and unprofessional work is unacceptable.

I promise to be open and available to you with office hours set aside for you to make an appointment to meet with me. I might not be able to solve every single one of your issues, concerns, complaints or grievances but I will do my best to make sure that you are listened to, valued, and respected.

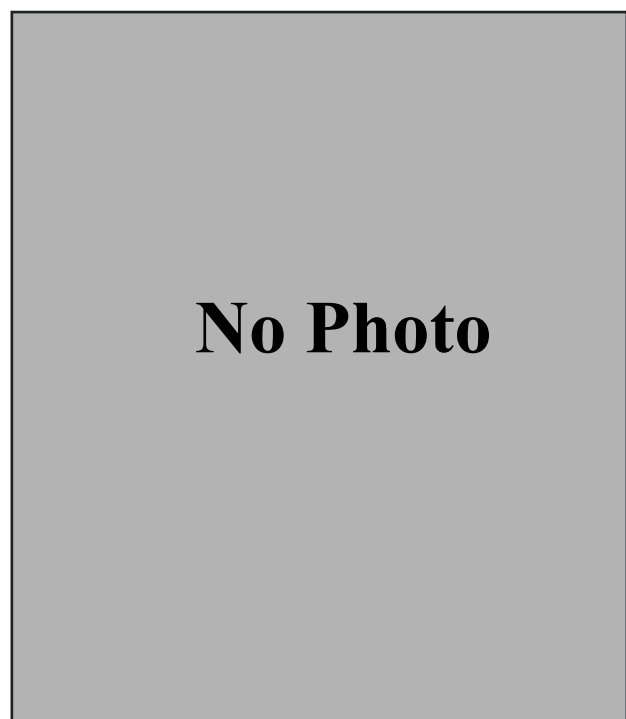

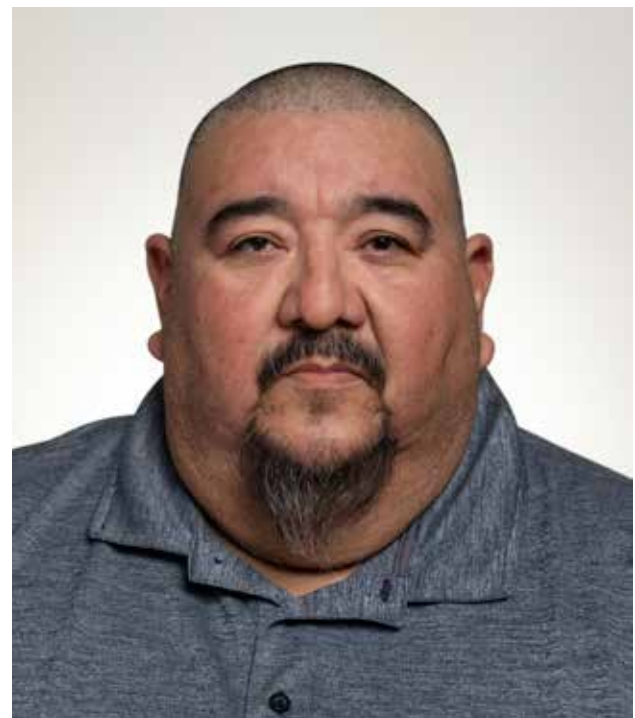

NO ONE EXCEPT VOTERS WHO HAVE NOT VOTED and the Election Officials, may be inside the 50 FOOT LIMIT. THERE SHALL BE NO ELECTIONEERING OR OTHER POLITICAL ACTIVITY WITHIN THE 50 FOOT LIMIT AREA. ELECTION OFFICIALS, VOTERS, OR OTHERS WITHIN THE 50 FOOT LIMIT SHALL NOT FORCE, INDUCE OR INFLUENCE ANY VOTER OR ATTEMPT TO DO SO.
